

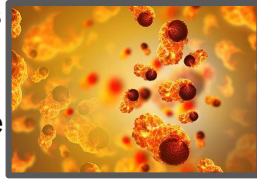

There are more than 100 types of cancer, and some are more harmful than others. One thing doctors try to do is detect cancer quickly so they can treat it quickly, just like it's easier to pull a few weeds out of a garden before they spread to the whole garden. Some cancers can only be found when people show symptoms. Scientists have discovered a new blood test that can detect over 50 types of cancer. 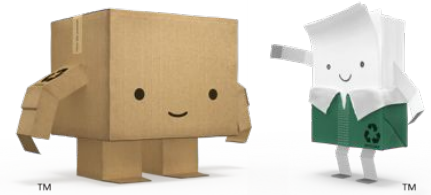


STEM +Cardboard +Careers

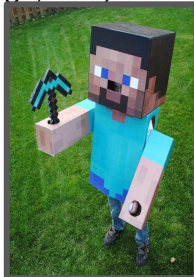
What else would be important when packaging a product? Pick an object in your home or classroom and try to design a package for it!

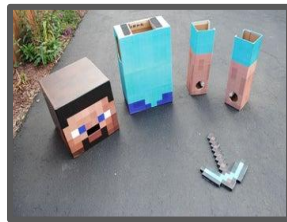


STEM Challenge
